## DATA FROM THE 2019 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM


In Utah, more than <u>1 in 5</u> unpaid caregivers are providing care to a loved one with Alzheimer's or another dementia.

More than half of dementia caregivers have been providing care for at least two years.

More than 1 in 3 dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


More than 1 in 3 dementia caregivers are in the "sandwich generation" — caring for both someone with dementia and a child or grandchild.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years


## Impact of Alzheimer's and dementia caregiving
