Nearly 1 in 4 caregivers in Alabama (23.5%) is providing care to an individual with Alzheimer's or other form of dementia.

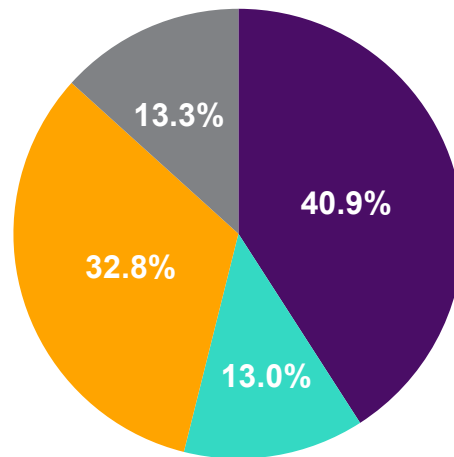

Health Effects

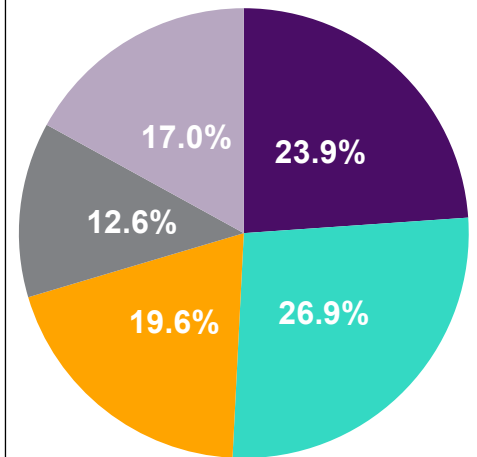
In frequent poor physical health	15.0%

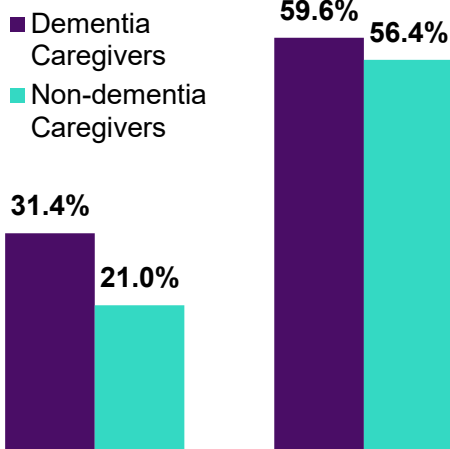

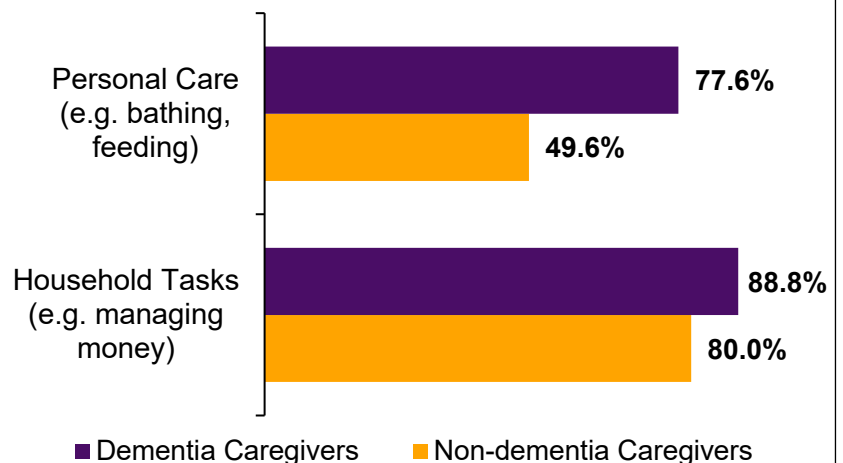
