
DATA FROM THE 2017 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In New Jersey, <u>nearly two-thirds</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

<u>More than one in three</u> Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


<u>Almost 60 percent</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide care to their parent or parent-in-law.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing help with specific tasks
