More than 1 in 5 caregivers in Georgia (22.4%) is providing care to an individual with Alzheimer's or other form of dementia.

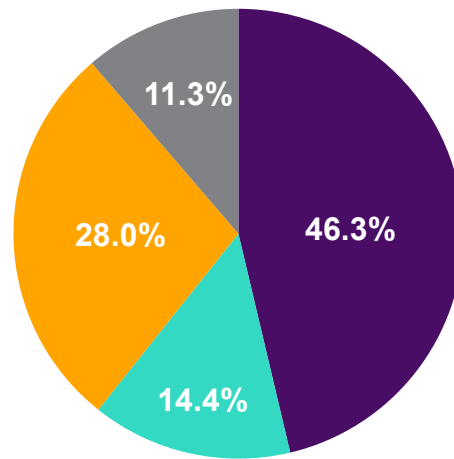

Health Effects

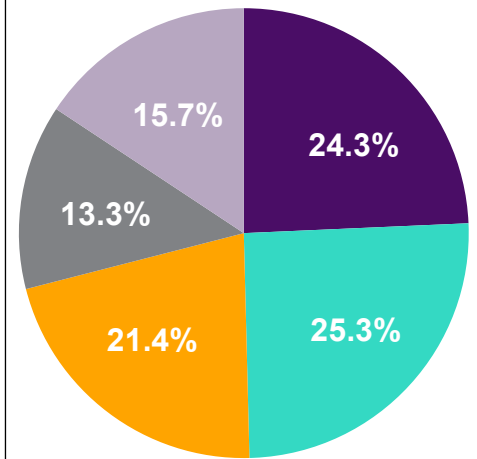
In frequent poor physical health	15.1%

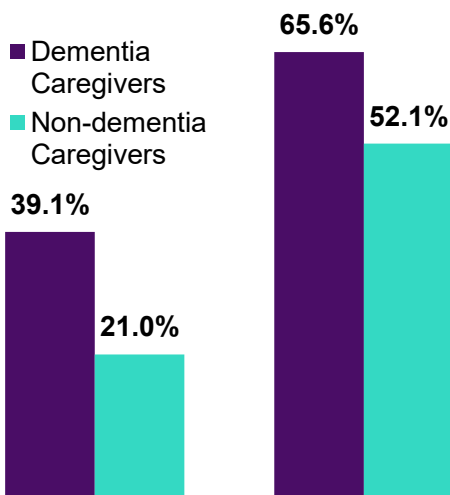

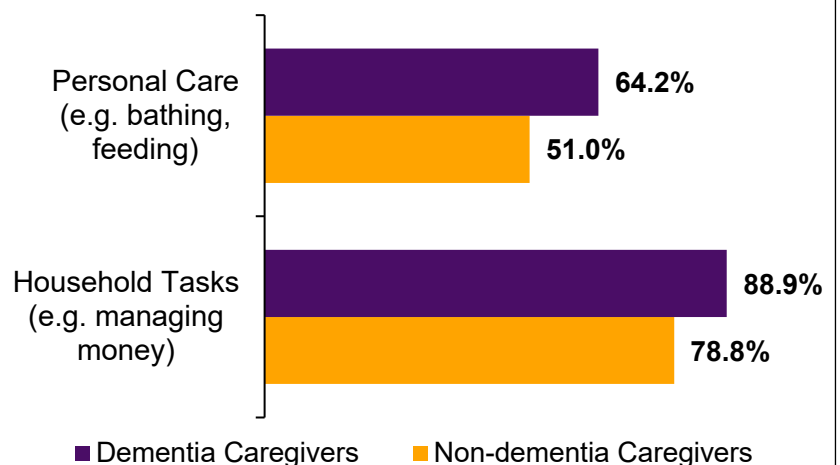
