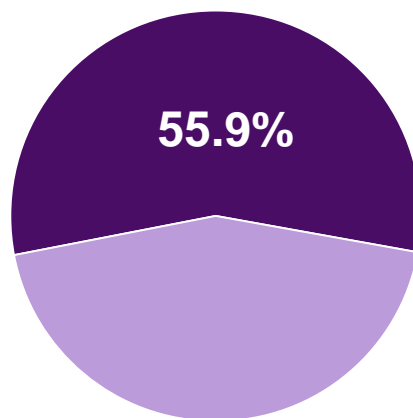


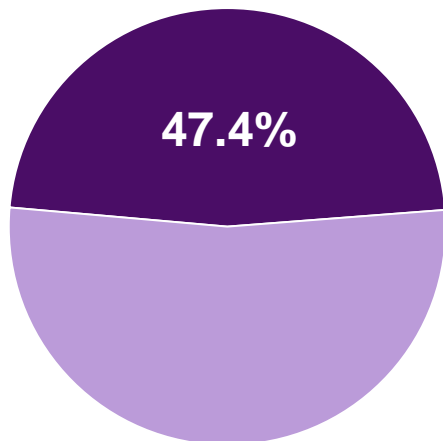
# dementia caregiving in arkansas

DATA FROM THE 2013 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

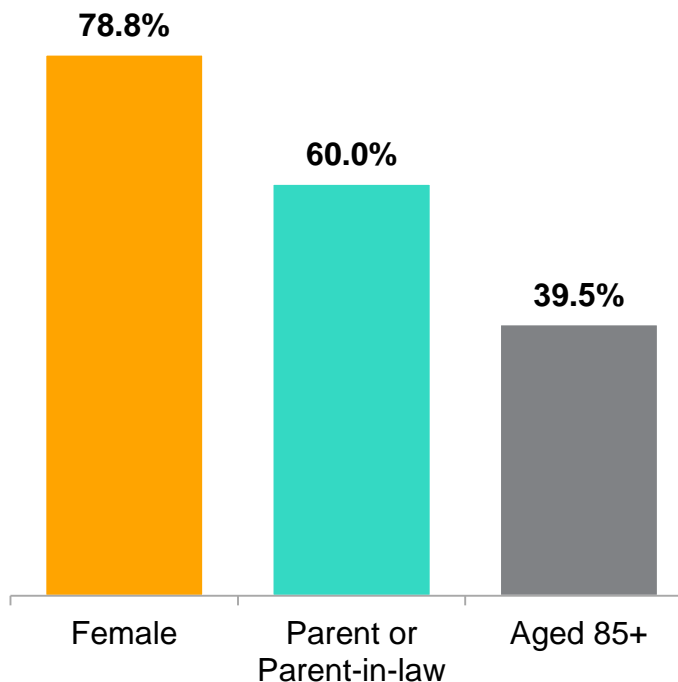
In Arkansas, among those who provide unpaid care to family and friends living with Alzheimer's and other dementias, more than half provide 20 or more hours of care per week.



Nearly half of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers have been providing care for at least two years.



Those with Alzheimer's and other dementias who receive care from family and friends are predominately female and either the parent or parent-in-law of the caregivers. Nearly 40 percent of them are among the oldest old.



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
