

DATA FROM THE 2011 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In California, 17 percent – more than one in six – of those aged 60 and over report that they are experiencing confusion or memory loss that is happening more often or is getting worse.

Over 85 percent of them have <u>not</u> talked to a health care professional about it.


For those with worsening memory problems, about one in three says it has interfered with household activities and/or work or social activities.




