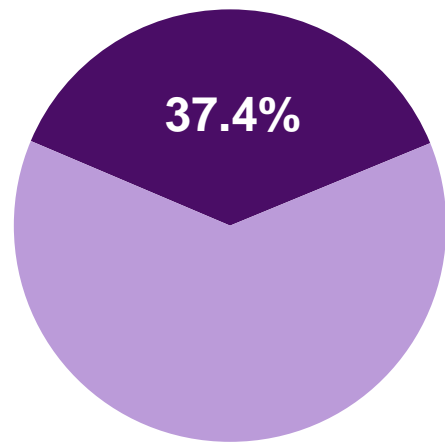
DATA FROM THE 2015 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Florida, more than one-third of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

Nearly one-third of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.

The majority of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers – more than 70 percent – provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.

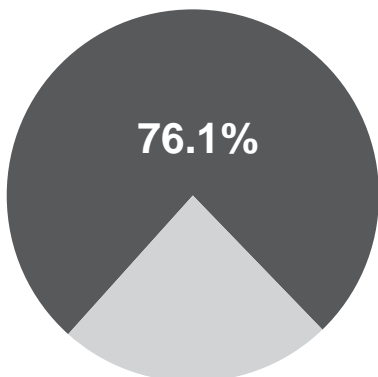
Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years
