



## dementia caregiving in missouri

## DATA FROM THE 2012 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Missouri, among those who provide unpaid care to family and friends living with Alzheimer's and other dementias, nearly 70 percent provide 20 or more hours of care per week.



More than 40 percent of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers have been providing care for at least two years.
