

DATA FROM THE 2013 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Puerto Rico, 8.2 percent of those aged 45 and over report they are experiencing confusion or memory loss that is happening more often or is getting worse.

More than 40 percent of them have <u>not</u> talked to a health care professional about it.


For those with worsening memory problems, nearly seven in ten say it has interfered with household activities and/or work or social activities.
