
DATA FROM THE 2020 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Utah, <u>nearly 60%</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

More than 30% of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


More than one-third of dementia caregivers are in the "sandwich generation" — caring for both someone with dementia and a child or grandchild.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years
