PALLIATIVE CARE

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Both Hospice and Palliative Care focus on improving the quality of life for the patient of any age through symptom management and supportive care.

TREATMENT

HOSPICE CARE...

- · Offers care for people who are living with a terminal illness
- Focuses on symptom management and comfort, when curative treatment is no longer possible or desired
- Offered at the end stage of an illness, often in the last six months of life
- · Patient must be terminally ill
- Patient agrees to not pursue life-prolonging measures
- Public and private insurance may have individualized guidelines

· Presence of a serious life-limiting illness

Offers care to those who are living with a serious life-limiting illness.
Can be offered while a person is receiving

· Available at any stage of a disease

curative or life-prolonging medical treatment

· May require a physician referral
