
EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The Alzheimer's Association is the leading voluntary health organization in Alzheimer's care, support, and research. More than 5 million Americans are currently living with Alzheimer's. The Heart of America Chapter provides vital programs and services to more than 50,000 individuals and 200,000 family members and caregivers struggling with the emotional, physical, and financial challenges of Alzheimer's disease in our bi-state service area.

Of the 5.5 million Americans with Alzheimer's, an estimated 5.3 million people are age 65 and older, and approximately 200,000 individuals are under age 65 (younger-onset Alzheimer's).

PROGRAM VOLUNTEERS

Mission-driven individuals who help us ensure access to gold-standard care and support for individuals who have Alzheimer's disease and their families and care partners.

- Community Educator: Public speaker who provides education and expands the reach of our educational offerings.
- Community Representative: Serves as a liaison between the Alzheimer's Association and local groups, such as neighborhoods, businesses, and civic organizations.
- Community Volunteer Leader: Helps recruit program volunteers, networks, builds relationships, plans and promotes local events, and evaluates community needs.
- Early Stage Social Engagement Leader:
 Plans, implements, and assures a positive experience during early stage social engagement events and activities.
- Faith Outreach Representative: Serves as a liaison between the Alzheimer's Association and local faith groups and congregations.
- **Promotore:** Traditionally known as a mentor, educator, or health advocate and serves as a liaison between the Alzheimer's Association and the Hispanic/Latino community.
- Support Group Facilitator (Caregiver or Early Stage): Creates a safe, open environment where people share their feelings, thoughts, and experiences in a combined effort to better cope with and manage the problems of dementia.
